

The problem

64-Bit editions of Windows 8 and 10, require digitally signed drivers. The problem is that many devices ship with unsigned drivers.

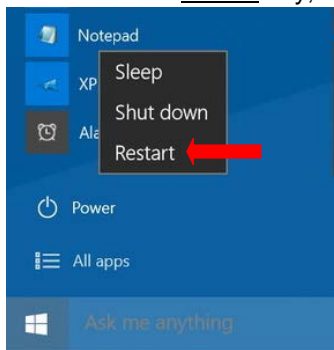
The solution

Disable driver signature verifications

How

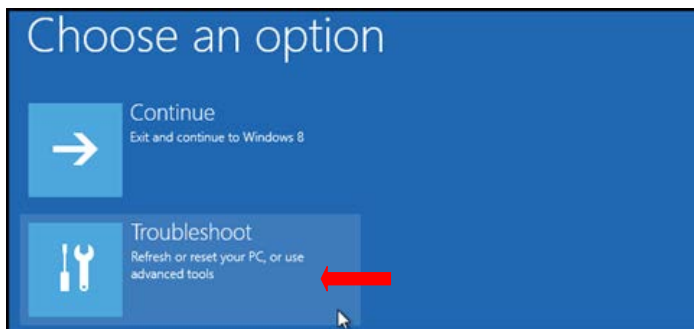
1. Get into the boot manager

Hold down the SHIFT key, and click on Restart in the power options menu.

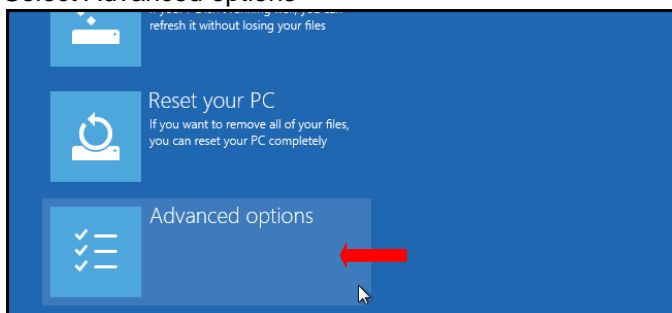


2. The PC will restart and enter boot manager.

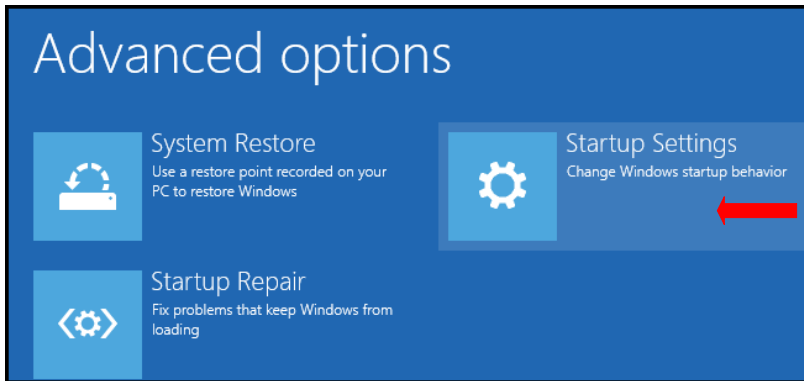
3. Select Troubleshoot



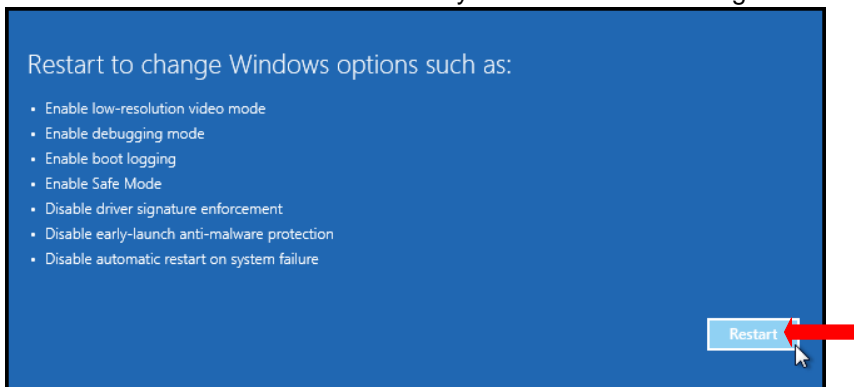
4. Select Advanced options



5. Select Startup Settings

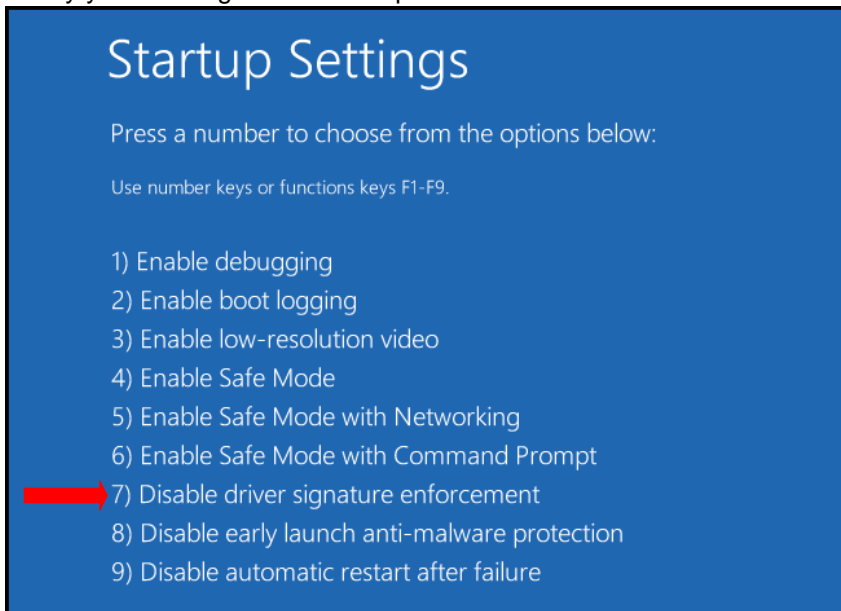


6. Click Restart to enter the mode where you can make the change



7. Wait for the PC to restart

8. Finally you will be given a list of options shown below.



9. Press F7 or 7 to select "Disable driver signature enforcement"

10. Wait for the PC to restart

You can now install the software / drivers which were previously blocked. NB - Disabling the signature verification is not permanent. It is only valid until you reboot the PC again.
